Biography

My career of over 30 years interweaves my leadership roles as a medical educator at the medical student, resident, fellow and faculty levels, and my passion as a Developmental Behavioral Pediatrician for improving the lives of children, youth and adults with Autism Spectrum Disorders and other Developmental Disabilities (ASD/DD) and their families. Over the past 10 years, I have focused on building primary care workforce capacity to meet the developmental, behavioral, and mental health needs of children and their families. I have developed and administered over 30 Project ECHO cohorts in Washington, Alaska, and Virginia, and embedded QI (MOC 4) into mental health ECHOs for pediatric primary care providers. Currently, as Co-Director of the Blue Ridge LEND and of the Virginia- LINKS state autism implementation grants, I lead interdisciplinary graduate level professionals to enhance their leadership, advocacy, and family-centered knowledge and skills in caring for individuals with ASD/DD. The work includes building systems of care at the local, state, regional and national levels. As the Education lead of the Virginia Mental Health Access Program since its inception in 2018, I oversee multiple ECHOs, ensure CME, edited the statewide VMAP guidebook.
